that the great majority of these records were made in the present century. You do well to illustrate the page with two such great riders as Arthur Zimmerman and Jimmy Michael. Arthur Zimmerman was probably one of the greatest, if not the greatest, sprint rider of them all and Jimmy Michael was outstanding at paced. It seems to me that I saw him in a race at Charles River Park when he was paced by a "six" and some quads. Those were the days before motor-paced races came into
