

Jack Natirboff of Montvale, New Jersey passed away in June, 1985. A CRCA Life Member, Natirboff raced actively in the twenties, competing against Louis Maltese and others of the era. He left racing to become a professional trick rider and was known as "Jack, the Bicycle Clown!" He gave trick riding and unicycle lessons. Jack collected antique and unusual bicycles and ran an antique bicycle prop service. He was a lifelong cyclist and supporter of the club, attending many club events. It was a tradition for Jack to lead the first lap of the 24-Hour Pepsi Bike Marathons in Central Park on a high-wheeler.

Fred Hamel

Fred Hamel of New York City, the CRCA Club Photographer also passed away in 1985. Fred was active in bike racing in the twenties and early thirties. In those days he raced with the Bronx County Wheelmen and was known as an outstanding sprinter. Fred was as professional photographer for over fifty years. He was an excellent portraitist, but he loved taking cycling and sailing photos. Fred was always willing to give a helping hand in club projects.
